Free Monthly Memberships to Employees**
HDR Honolulu First Employer to Cover Full Biki Memberships

HONOLULU – Fitness center, bus pass, parking allowance, and daycare. These are some of the perks employers offer their workers. Now Honolulu companies can add Biki memberships to that list. Bikeshare Hawaii today announced the downtown Honolulu office of HDR, a global firm providing architecture, engineering, environmental and construction services, is the first to partner with Biki to offer a sustainable transportation benefit to its employees by offering fully subsidized memberships to all interested employees through a custom designed program.

“We are delighted to partner with HDR to offer a sustainable, healthy and convenient transportation option for its employees,” said Lori McCarney, CEO of Bikeshare Hawaii. “There are five Biki Stops located within a five-minute walk of HDR’s Fort Street Mall office. With their Biki membership, Biki members can easily hop on a Biki bike and connect with Biki’s 100 station network for lunch, meetings or run errands around town.”

“HDR’s Honolulu Green Team strives to promote environmental stewardship while building a culture of sustainability,” said Randy Harrington, Water Resources EIT and Green Team champion. “For us, sustainability is about advocating for innovative, environmentally conscious ideas in our community. The partnership with Bikeshare Hawaii provides HDR an opportunity to put these ideals into action.”

“We are extremely fortunate to be employee-owners at HDR. HDR’s supportive, nurturing leadership guides us to create a culture that we can and want to be a part of – a more sustainable tomorrow,” added Gail Haraguchi, associate vice president of HDR. “At HDR, we strive to do things better and stretch further, and this is a prime example of the opportunity to partner with Biki.”

Thirty-one HDR employees have signed up for the \$15 Monthly Plan which offers an unlimited number of 30-minute rides. HDR is the first company to cover the full cost of a monthly membership for all

interested employees. Biki also has set up employee plans with Ulupono Initiative, American Savings Bank, Hawaii Pacific Health, HEI and HMSA.

Biki's team of dedicated local employees are on board to interact with the community, answer questions and resolve issues, keep Biki Stops well maintained and stocked, and ensure bikes are all set to ride. Honolulu is the first city in the world to have a fleet of PBSC Urban Solutions' easy-to-ride FIT bikes.
